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This Annual Report is produced now, at the end of 2011, to reflect some changes taking place at the RS Resources Centre. 2012 sees the RS Resource Centre moving forward into a new era.

From January 2012 the Nottingham Bluecoat School becomes an Academy and we are delighted to say that the Academy will continue to host the Centre in its present location within the Aspley Lane Campus.

This report reflects a continuing reduction in our reserves, following the earlier loss of all financial support from the local Education Authorities, in 2010.

The centre has continued to explore sources of alternative funding, as yet to no avail. Our finances will in future come under the care of the Bluecoat Foundation Trustees, which is a registered charity and future subscriptions and other payments to us will be payable through this body. The Centre has continued to offer loans to subscribers as well as advice and guidance on a range of issues relating to Religious Education. It has worked closely with the Nottingham Inter Faith Council [NIFC], which has been in partnership with the Centre since the early days.

There has been considerable expansion in the Faith Experience Project, particularly across schools in the County. One local district Council has been so pleased with the pilot that we ran in some of their schools that they have offered subsidised experiences to other schools in their area.

The evaluation comments we have received from schools have shown that this is a valued way of teaching RE and has been welcomed by pupils and teachers alike. It has been pleasing to receive requests for return visits from schools as we build up positive relationships with the school communities.

We have also been grateful to NIFC for assisting in finding faith members to accompany these visits whenever possible.

A report about the Faith Experiences appeared in the Autumn Term Newsletter of the RE Council of England and Wales.

During this period the Centre has attended the County Primary Head Teacher's Conference and has delivered training about RE. to students from Nottingham SCITT.

We are members of the National Federation of RE Centres and through this have engaged in dialogue with other centres.

The centre has also worked with St John's College, to promote a RE training conference for Post 16 students, during this period.

To develop the Faith Experience project to engage young people in discovering more about religion in new ways

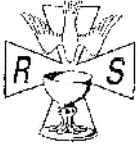
The Centre Manager has overall responsibility for the project. There is a Management Committee which consists of various stakeholders
