

## Various activities

- 1. Why do you think people volunteer to help at the kitchen?

  Can you create an advert for volunteers to help, what skills might they need?
  - 2. Why do you think it is good that two faiths, at least work together on this project?
  - 3. "Religion is based on action not words"

How does the work of the SaSh kitchen show this in your view?

- 4. What kind of projects are there round your school in the local community from faith groups can you find out about?
- 5. How could your school assist people in the local community?
- 6. What message do you thing guests get about people who are involved in SaSh kitchen and about faith?

The following were suggested by pupils who were involved:

- Design a meal or write a recipe that you would create for people from food donated
- Make some food/bake for others and then distribute food in the local community
- Grow things to distribute to other people/write about people's reactions to this generosity
- Write letters/thank you letters to the charities who support others
- Write down our own ideas about where we could help people/where we need charities/why we need to help people
- Similarities and differences between different charities in our local area/compare them
- Write the story of a person involved in this charity/ the story of a
  quest of the service
- Make a shoe box model of the charity include labels for how they help people
- Make a poster to advertise the charity
- Draw your impressions of what happens to the family after they have received a meal/ and what happens to the volunteers - how they are changed/affected by it
- At the end of the unit, make an overall big picture including everything to do with the charity - to sum up learning - include text boxes/labels/flaps to add information
